## **Selectmen's Report January 2020**

Three years ago at Town Meeting, a curious resident asked what seemed at the time to be a simple question: How many streetlights are there in Sedgwick? Someone made an educated guess which was close enough to the truth, and the answer, eighteen, was easy enough to find on the town's electric bill. This past summer, however, two dedicated and intrepid residents, Leslie Schneider and David Anderson, set out to answer the important streetlight questions: Where are they? Do they work? Are they necessary? The task was an important one because the Selectboard had decided to take advantage of Emera's program to convert the old, inefficient lighting to modern LED. It involved bushwhacking, spreadsheets and GPS. And, as it happens, two of the streetlights on our electric bill seemed to have no meaningful function at all, and no one knew how they had come into existence in the first place. So after abandoning the useless ones and adding a new one on the corner of Reach Road and South Cross Road, we now have seventeen streetlights, seven of which have been converted to LED. Everyone should be pleased to know that the new lights use three times less electricity than the ones they replaced. Good work Leslie and David.

2019 has been a year for collaboration. Sedgwick, along with Brooklin and Brooksville, began to investigate alternatives to our long relationship with the Blue Hill/Surry Transfer Station. Fiberight, the new waste processing facility under construction in Hampden, was missing its deadlines for accepting waste, and the three towns decided that they needed a Plan B in the event that the new facility did not deliver on its promises. We formed a joint committee to research alternatives. We toured both Orland's newly built transfer station and PERC, the existing waste-to-energy facility in Orrington. We developed a plan outlining construction and operation costs for a new three-town transfer station. Our budget for this fiscal year includes \$15,000 in the event that we need to begin acting upon Plan B. The relationships built between Sedgwick, Brooklin and Brooksville during this process of collaboration will serve us well in the future. Having good working relationships at the



Selectboard level, relationships built on trust and mutual respect, will help us tackle the difficult issues our small towns face in the years to come. The more we can see that we're all in this together the better off we'll be.

## **Sedgwick Budget Committee Report January 24, 2020**

The town budget committee met regularly through December and January to review the budget requests received at the town office. We spoke with Fire Chief David Carter and Road Commissioner Paul Carter about their portions of the town budget; their requests remained unchanged. PAC sent Bob Vaughan for an evening with the committee to review the progress they have made under manager Alan Henschke, which thankfully will not require another increase. The meetings were educational for the committee, and we generally recommended the amounts requested, although not always unanimously. Each organization is asked to provide an indication of the number of Sedgwick residents served, services provided, fee structure if any, and funding sources for their programs. The majority of the organizations provide audited financial statements. In a few instances a review of the material prompted the committee to ask questions of groups that had not specifically been asked to appear before the committee.

Our final meeting involved a review with the selectmen of the warrant articles that include all the town accounts, the school budget excepted. We note that Sedgwick's selectmen have tried over the years to minimize the tax increases that inevitably arise. They were able to lower requests for sludge disposal and general assistance, while most other accounts did not see increases. Several that did are accounts over which selectmen have no budget authority —the county tax, the Hancock County Communication Center (RCC) and Blue Hill-Surry Transfer Station. The citizens of the town elect a School Committee that works with SU76 administrators and Superintendent to prepare a budget for the school system. This represents the largest portion of our town's expenses and selectmen and budget committee all try to stay attuned to the school budget.

As a committee we appreciate the work of the many community members who volunteer their time for the benefit of the community. While we know a few townspeople receive small stipends for their efforts, we also recognize that the time and efforts involved far exceed any monetary reward. We hope all citizens will make an effort to vote at town meeting. Being involved has its own reward.

## **CEO Report January 2020**

I came back into office this past September and immediately found that the Planning Board was ready to hold a special meeting to make sure that a proposed day care center got its approvals in time to meet State requirements and a pressing time frame. Our thanks to a dedicated, hard working Board.

In the past year there were about 35 real estate broker assisted sales in town as well as some private transactions. Ten or more of the sales were in the shoreland zone. At present there are about 13 active or pending sales in the shoreland zone.

One matter that occurs too often is loud tree harvesting operations that start as early as 4 o'clock in the morning to the great annoyance of abutting property owners. Without a specific ordinance to address this, aggrieved property owners only have limited assistance from the Maine Forest Service to turn to.

There are at least four new construction projects about to start in the Shoreland Zone. Additionally contractors and property owners continue to check in about getting Building Notification Forms for general work in all areas of the town.

As before, the State Building Code (M.U.B.E.C.) is not in place for Sedgwick or other communities with a population of less than 4,000. However, most construction work must meet some State and Federal guidelines.

The Sedgwick Volunteer Fire Department had a very busy year in 2019. Our volunteer firefighters responded to 76 incidents for a total of 864 hours. Our volunteers also spent 1,237 hours training in 2019. Training covered a wide variety of subjects including structural fire attack, Basic Firefighting, emergency vehicle operations, extrication, SCBA, cold water rescue and pumper operations. Our muster team won the Maine State Federation of Firefighters Annual Convention Muster again this year after training for several months. A vast amount of time has also been spent in regular monthly meetings, committee

meetings, Hancock County Firefighters Association meetings, fund raising, fire prevention activities and work sessions.

Due to the outstanding support of the people of Sedgwick, we have been able to start replacing our aging SCBA (air packs). We have purchased 2 new SCBA and 14 new facepieces for our interior fire attack personnel. This is a major project financially with each SCBA costing about \$5,500. In December, the department received a grant for \$30,000 to help purchase these new SCBA. We have ordered 6 more new SCBA to be delivered in the next month. That will leave us with 4 more SCBA to replace in the next couple years.

The department wishes to thank the residents, town officials and tax payers for your continued support. Your support is essential to the future of the department. We continue to strive to be the best we can be.

Remember, to reach any emergency services for the Town of Sedgwick, you must dial **911**. The Enhanced 911 system gives dispatchers the exact location an emergency call is coming from, thus saving emergency responders critical time by providing better directions to the emergency. If you are calling from a cell phone, the location of the emergency is not pinpointed. You must give the dispatcher the best directions possible. **Dial 911 for any emergency.** It is also very important to have your house number where it is visible to emergency responders. If you have any questions regarding house numbers, please feel free to call the department.

Due to the severe weather events in recent years, we urge all the residents of Sedgwick to be prepared for extended loss of power as well as loss of phone service. Residents should have sufficient food and water to last up to a week. Check on your neighbor. If you know of someone that needs some sort of assistance, contact a member of the fire department or the town office. We can't help anyone that needs assistance if we don't know that they need help. A battery powered radio is essential to receive bulletins and updates on the situation. Be careful with backup heat sources as well as portable generators. **Be prepared.**

Fire safety needs to be practiced in each and every home. Smoke detectors should be located on each level of your home. Check and test them regularly. Clean them and replace the batteries twice a year. If you need and cannot afford a smoke detector, contact the department and we will provide one free of charge. We also have a few devices to help alert a hearing-impaired person if a smoke detector is activated. Develop home fire drills, preplan your escape routes and practice them regularly. Establish a safe meeting place outside the

building. If you have any questions regarding fire safety, contact the department.

Adequate access to your property is essential for the fire department or other emergency services. Please maintain a vegetation-free buffer of at least 20 feet of width and 15 feet in height. This allows us room to access your property in case of a fire or other emergency.

Open burning permits are only available at Eggemoggin Country Store, 359-2125. **It is necessary to call well in advance** to make sure someone is available to write the permit. Remember, you must have a permit to engage in any outdoor burning.

I wish to thank all our volunteer firefighters for their dedicated service to the Town of Sedgwick. Our firefighters give a tremendous amount of time and many times risk their lives to protect our citizens and property. Our firefighters do their job for the pride and satisfaction of providing a great service to our town. They are a very dedicated group of people. We are lucky to have them!

## **BLUE HILL HERITAGE TRUST**

### **Annual Report – January 2020**

Blue Hill Heritage Trust's mission is "to lead in conserving land, water, and wildlife habitat on the greater Blue Hill Peninsula. To teach and practice a stewardship ethic. To promote ecological, economic, and community health for this and future generations." We welcome use of our properties for a variety of uses including hunting, and we hope that the community is taking full advantage of our land and trails.

This has been a good year for the Trust, and we were particularly happy to finalize the purchase of the property adjacent to our Cooper Farm on Caterpillar Hill. Fundraising for this was done in collaboration with Maine Coast Heritage Trust and Island Heritage Trust. We did this to protect more of the spectacular view from the hill, and we will be taking the buildings down in early 2020 and working on all the fields below. The Trust was also gifted an additional 43 acres next to our Snow's Cove Preserve last year, which brings our current holding in Sedgwick to 368 acres.

In 2019 the Trust voluntarily paid \$2,798 in real estate taxes to Sedgwick and a total of \$17,100 to all the towns in our service area. Our lands are open to the public and we maintain trails, but we continue to believe that it is important to keep land on the tax rolls. In addition, our properties provide a return in ecosystem services, public health, in recreational and traditional uses, and indirectly in the tourist dollars that flow to our area precisely because our communities protect and preserve land and water.

We held a number of public events in Sedgwick last year: hikes, educational programs, and also a gathering at Strong Brewing for this year's hiking challenge. Over last summer, we also held public listening sessions in all our towns, including two in Sedgwick. I want to thank all those who took time out of a busy summer to share ideas and ask questions. In our annual report this year we will give an overview of those sessions, as well as the public survey we conducted last year.

Blue Hill Heritage Trust is committed to both conserving land in our towns and serving those communities, and we want to thank all our Sedgwick supporters for being our partners in this work. We are very much looking forward to another good year in 2020 and hope to see many of you out enjoying the land and water this coming year.

## Blue Hill Public Library Municipal Report 2019-2020

In 2019 the Blue Hill Library (BHPL) continued to be a community gathering place, a common ground for residents of, and visitors to, the Blue Hill Peninsula.

### 1. Activities

During 2019 BHPL:

- Welcomed 126,442 patron visits. The library averaged 417 visits each business day.
- Issued 801 new library cards, a 28% increase compared to the 625 cards issued in 2018.
- Loaned 105,457 physical and digital items (books, audiobooks, movies, etc.). Use of physical items in the library collection decreased slightly, 2%, while digital library use increased 17%.
- Answered 2,328 reference questions. In addition, library staff and volunteers provided 1,391 technology help sessions to patrons.
- Hosted 15,360 WiFi sessions and 7,577 sessions in our in-house computers and tablets.
- Sponsored 694 cultural programs that attracted 10,339 attendees. Of these cultural programs, 429 were geared towards adults with 6,083 attendees, and 265 youth programs were enjoyed by 4,256 children, teenagers, and caregivers.
- Was the site for an additional 487 community-sponsored events (lectures, movies, meetings, etc.) with an estimated attendance of 5,388. Combining library-sponsored and community-sponsored events, BHPL was a gathering place for 1,181 events and 15,727 attendees.

### 2. Funding

The 2020 operating budget is projected at \$637,736. Funds for operations are broken down as follows: **Operating Income**, primarily from endowment, 50%; **Annual Fundraising**, 34%; **Municipal Funding**, 16%, provided by Blue Hill, Penobscot, Sedgwick and Surry.

The 2020 library budget increased by \$66,000 compared to 2019. Most of the overall increase (\$62,792) is being borne by increased funding from the endowment. The largest part of that increase is related to a new staff position, made possible by a gift to the BHPL endowment. The "Ruth Slaven Teen Services and Outreach Librarian" is now serving

our middle through high schoolers and is meeting a previously unmet need in our community, both during and after school hours.

All of us at BHPL are proud to serve our community, six days, 55 hours weekly, year-round. We thank you for the honor and privilege.

### **Peninsula Ambulance Corps Report to the Towns 2019**

This was the first year of Peninsula Ambulance Corps (PAC) 6<sup>th</sup> decade! Our longevity is due not only to the dedication of staff and management but also to the steadfast support of our Town governments and those many private citizens who respond to our appeal every year.

Our new manager, Alan Henschke, completed his first full year at PAC. The management team is continuing to reorganize our business model to improve efficiency and to match our staffing model with call volume patterns. 2019 performance demonstrates how these changes have improved our bottom line. We have had an increase in the availability of ambulances to serve the community and an increase in our call volume.

PAC has partnered with Healthy Peninsula, At Home Downeast, and Northern Light Blue Hill Hospital to provide Community Paramedicine services to the communities we serve and been approved by the State of Maine to do so. Funded by a grant, there is no charge to patients at this time. The program enables EMS staff to visit patients in their homes and provide services such as welfare checks, home safety evaluations, medication reconciliation, vital sign checks and other procedures as requested by a patient's physician. PAC then provides reports to the patient's physician and care givers.

We are proud of our 5 full-time and 25 part-time staff – the Paramedics and EMTs who make the program work. We continue to provide staff with continuing education for mandated federal and state classes. Our employees like their jobs and provide real benefit to the communities we serve.

Our fleet of three ambulances allows us to maintain our staffing model of two on-duty ambulances with a spare to use when an ambulance needs to be serviced. This also allows us to staff the third ambulance for a stand-by such as the Blue Hill Fair and at times of high

call volume. We utilize management to staff the third ambulance during these high-volume times, which allows us to respond to more calls.

Our largest customers remain Medicare (federal government) and Medicaid/MaineCare (state government). Together, they represent 44% of our billing. However, for every \$1 of that billing, we are paid only \$0.70 at best. Medicaid reimbursements are often less than 50%. This accounts for most of our operating deficit. The remaining shortfall is the result of running a service in a large territory with a small population.

Call volume – the basis upon which we are reimbursed – was 1,448, an increase of 370 calls from 2018. Totals by Towns are given in the chart below. Inter-hospital patient transports, which were 39% of call volume, are also included in call totals. We identified another 25 calls (all non-emergency) which we could have completed if we had had available staff. This is down from 69 calls in 2018. This increase improves our income and our service to all residents of the Greater Blue Hill Peninsula.

We decrease our deficit in three ways: with the support of our town governments, by individual donations to our annual appeal, and by using volunteer board members to accomplish administrative and fund-raising tasks.

This year we are asking our Towns for the same support as last year: \$18.50 for the operating budget and \$4.43 for the ambulance reserve fund, for a total of \$22.93 per capita. Next year, in addition to increasing our call volume, we will be further invigorating our annual campaign.

Staff and ambulances are the visible aspects of PAC, but community loyalty and the funds provided by the Towns are its lifeblood. Our annual appeal to the public provides an essential and remarkably consistent source of support, but we must rely to the greatest extent on the common sense of Town governments and citizens to understand the necessity for an ambulance service, and that, if we don't hang together and make it work, no one else will.

Report to the Town**

The Sedgwick Library Association serves the general population of the Town of Sedgwick, the peninsula and the island. We offer a variety of services including full time free internet service, an ever growing selection of books with an emphasis on Maine resources and literature, opportunities for local vendors at our mini-farmers' market, and community building through gathering, conversation, and presentations on subjects of interest to the general community. Our efforts have resulted in a mostly closed library starting to become a center for the benefit of the community and increased the vibrancy of the village area specifically and by extension the Town.

The Sedgwick Library is free for all patrons. We do not discriminate on the basis of geography. We circulated more than 150 (estimate) books being signed out-about half again as many as last year. Many more visited our little library and joined us for discussions on Saturday mornings.

This year featured the second in a series of talks on outdoor opportunities. Roland Boutwell, Educator of the Year for the New England Wildflower Association, led a plant walk through the 100 Acre Woods and will be back next year to lead a walk through Scott's Landing. We served as a pick up point for the Magic Food Bus as well.

The library also offered a musical event, Jazz on the Lawn, which showcased the talents of Scott Cleveland and John Gallagher and provided another community building activity. In this fourth Jazz event about 50 people enjoyed a lovely evening on the lawn. We raised over \$2,000 at the event, which included a silent auction.

In addition to the generosity of the Town, we raised several thousand dollars from private citizens, a fund raising letter, and our Jazz on the Lawn event. Additionally, the board of directors, as individuals, donate the fund for the toilet facilities. We were not able to do that this year, so there were no bathroom facilities for patrons (or the board members). This kept visits unfortunately short. The library also accepted in kind donations of resources and time. We are especially appreciative of the Blue Hill Library for their thoughtful donation of the culls from their collection.

In the last four years, the Sedgwick Village Library brought a valuable and underutilized resource into the modern era, i.e. internet service. We have done this with the generosity of the Town, the board of directors, and many, many citizens who have helped. In moving

ahead, we have had to commit to ongoing payments for bathroom facilities and internet services. It is our hope to use the \$600 to cover the cost of the internet. We already had citizens who would normally not have access to the internet, including students and business people, stop in to use our service.

## **Sedgwick Elementary School 2020 Principal's Report**

The 2019-2020 school year at Sedgwick Elementary School is off to a great start, and it is my pleasure and honor to be a part of it. The teachers are embracing some needed changes, both in curriculum and scheduling, that promise to bring about improved academic success for our students in the years to come. We are blessed to be a part of such a caring community, and I would like to thank the school committee, the school staff, parents, students, and the many volunteers who help our school to be the warm and welcoming heart of our community.

We have taken a long hard look at where we are and where we would like to be and have begun the strategic planning process for our school. We have surveyed the community to identify what it sees as imperative to the education of our town's children. We are now working with a committee of community members, parents and educators to develop a strategic plan that will enable us to achieve the goals we have identified.

We are in the third year of working with a literacy consultant which has made a major difference in our elementary students' reading abilities. At the end of last year in our k-2 classrooms over 75% of our students were reading at or above grade level. This number will continue to grow as our teachers work together on literacy.

We are also embracing a new math curriculum this year and receiving professional development to assist our teachers with its implementation. This new program, Eureka, more closely aligns to state and national standards and promotes mathematical reasoning and thinking skills. It will help our students both improve their grade level skills but also learn to better solve problems that they encounter in the world of tomorrow. Our goal is to make strides similar to those we have made in literacy.

I would like to make particular note of our newly implemented RTI (response to intervention) program. During this time, teachers, specialists and educational technicians work together to supplement the regular instruction and address gaps in some students' learning while also providing enrichment opportunities for others. As a school, this is an important tool to try and give every student the extra support they need in order to become more successful learners.

Another highlight of the educational experience at Sedgwick Elementary School is the newly implemented STEAM Program. This is where teachers work together with our STEAM instructor to add project

based learning into the classroom. Together they use Science, Technology, Engineering, Art, and Math (STEAM) to explore solutions to 21<sup>st</sup> century problems. This program is exciting and students and teachers are doing wonderful things with it in our classrooms.

We have recently received a grant to implement a new social emotional learning program called Second Step. Teachers will be integrating this within their regular classroom instruction to provide lessons about kindness, perseverance, bullying, peer pressure, etc. This combined with the Restorative Justice practices we are utilizing is sure to build upon our already positive school culture.

Educating our young people is one of the most important things that a community can do. It is the thing that ensures that we will continue to thrive and solve the problems that life presents along the way. Even though its importance is paramount, it is necessary to use fiscal responsibility when making educational decisions. To show my commitment to frugality amidst rising costs I evaluated all positions and educational materials at our school. We have been able to reduce our Title One program costs by meeting those educational needs through staffing changes and by using our newly implemented RTI program. These changes won't reduce support for our students, but will instead enhance their learning.

Projected student enrollment calls for an educational technician to be hired to meet state regulations in our Pre-K program. It is either this or turn some of our most important young students away and create an uneven starting point. Providing a Pre-K experience for all of Sedgwick's youngest students is pivotal to realizing the vision we have for education in our community. Instead of hiring a full-time person we will be able to reallocate some existing educational technician duties and only hire a part-time ed tech to meet this growing need in 20-21.

In closing, I am pleased to be a part of this educational community, and am looking forward to leading Sedgwick Elementary School as we advance our educational vision.

Superintendent's Report  
January, 2020**

It is my honor to be sharing another Superintendent's Report with the citizens of Sedgwick. Sedgwick Elementary School not only supports our students who attend during the school year, but also serves as a hub of activity for many community-based activities and events for the Sedgwick community throughout the year. It is through these multiple uses that our sense of community is enhanced. As a frugal community on the peninsula many thanks go to our parents, guardians and community members for your efforts at supporting our students, staff and school through multiple volunteer efforts! If something extra is needed, the call for support is answered by you. Thanks also for your support of our school's present 2019-2020 budget, which demonstrates your promise to educate each of our students to become the next generation for the Town of Sedgwick.

The School Union 76 office continues to work with the community and Selectmen on ideas and concerns effecting our school and community. I am happy to report that the level of trust between School Union 76, the Sedgwick School Committee and the Town of Sedgwick is strong. Our efforts to share information, discuss strengths and concerns and review budget needs on both the town's and school's fronts has made us stronger than ever! Our shared focus and trust allows us to speak openly, try to plan for future needs, discuss present concerns and problem-solve together. These mutual efforts can be seen through shared focus and contributions being made on our school's strategic planning efforts, which will result in a completed plan this spring. The growth of our shared-focus and trust over the last three years continues to help make Sedgwick Elementary School the best school that it can be!

Starting last winter and continuing into this school year we have made multiple adjustments and changes to improve and enhance instruction in Reading and Math. By analyzing our school's past and present academic results, our teachers and staff are working with first year Principal Carla Magoon to find gaps in each student's learning, work toward improving student success while also increasing the expectations we have for our staff and for our students. One of the instructional changes made this year is the addition of an academic intervention block into the school day to assist students who have skill or knowledge weaknesses. This block is used to either reteach or supplement student learning around specific standards or skill needs.

“STEAM” Blocks (Science, Technology, Engineering, Art, Math) have also been added, helping to create more hands-on, interest-based learning experiences. If measured by student excitement, they are having a most positive effect.

Last year because of our school’s previous academic results (as measured by state testing), we were to gain greater oversight and support from the Maine Department of Education (MDOE). Unfortunately, this did not come to pass as the MDOE had funding problems to work out with the US Department of Education. These concerns took almost a year to fix, and so the aid promised has only just recently come to us. However, this delay did not stop our efforts to start to make needed improvements. We will now use the added State funding for additional professional development and materials that will build on what has already taken place at our school. Combined, these efforts will give our staff an even better opportunity to improve their instructional skills while at the same time helping to improve our students’ skills and overall success.

The 2020-2021 proposed budget is higher than we wanted to bring to you, but an increased number of tuition students going to high school, increased special education costs for students in grades 9-12 which we must pay, and an increased number of students coming into Pre-school result in costs that we cannot reduce unless we deny access to students. In order to reduce the overall potential budget increase, cuts have been made to some positions (music and guidance), along with multiple small reductions in several other areas. The proposed budget will continue to support student learning and growth and is asking our voters for an overall education increase of 3.71%. To ensure that the proposed increase goes no higher, we are using the remaining \$13,500 from Pre-school fundraising, \$10,000 from the Maintenance Reserve and \$65,000 from our balance-forward funds.

The School Committee and I have started discussions with the Selectmen about the need to look at how we will pay for Pre-K – 12 education in the years to come. The budgeted architect study, completed this past fall, also identified multiple issues with mechanical systems along with wear and tear inside and outside of our building that must be dealt with in the near future. The present funding model we are following along with future building needs will not be sustainable for much longer and so a larger discussion will need to be started within our community. This discussion will be one of the elements of the coming strategic plan.

The staff of Sedgwick Elementary School is to be thanked for their many positive efforts in making instructional and system changes

over the last 9 months. Besides our students, our staff is the key ingredient in improving student learning at our school. Thanks must also to Ms Magoon, our new principal. Ms. Magoon took over last Spring during a time of turmoil and has been working successfully with parents and staff ever since to improve communication and make the instructional change needed to improve our school's expertise and students' success.

I know you will agree when I say that our greatest resource at Sedgwick Elementary School is our young people! I, like you, always feel fortunate when I get to spend time with them. The smiles, kindness and respect shown to me by our school's students fills my cup!

We continue our program and facilities planning to correct long-standing issues and set GSA up for the next few decades with a first rate campus and programming, looking at all we do to be sure we are making the best use of the resources we have, and forming plans to get the resources we need. ## **Finances**

The state-set tuition rate for FY19 was \$11,759.07, but our actual per-student-cost was close to \$14,700 (comparable to the costs of similarly-sized public high schools). To close tuition gaps like this one, we have, for years, relied on three additional revenue sources: *income from our endowment* (following strict laws limiting the amount we can spend); *philanthropic gifts* to the school, including the annual GSA Fund which goes directly into the operating budget; and *surplus revenue from our international boarding program*. Revenue from that third source has diminished dramatically over the past two years, and is unlikely to rebound. For that reason, we have begun discussions with the “tuitioning” towns (including Blue Hill) about increasing tuition (Maine law allows this) to help us close the tuition gap.

Report on the Financial Statements

We have audited the accompanying financial statements of the governmental activities, each major fund and the aggregate remaining fund information of the Town of Sedgwick, Maine (the Town) as of and for the fiscal year ended June 30, 2019, including the related notes to the financial statements, which collectively comprise the Town's basic financial statements as listed in the table of contents.

Management's Responsibility for the Financial Statements

Management is responsible for the preparation and fair presentation of these financial statements in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America; this includes the design, implementation, and maintenance of internal control relevant to the preparation and fair presentation of financial statements that are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error.

Auditor's Responsibility

Our responsibility is to express opinions on these financial statements based on our audit. We conducted our audit in accordance with auditing standards generally accepted in the United States of America. Those standards require that we plan and perform the audit to obtain reasonable assurance about whether the financial statements are free from material misstatement.

An audit involves performing procedures to obtain audit evidence about the amounts and disclosures in the financial statements. The procedures selected depend on the auditor's judgment, including the assessment of the risks of material misstatement of the financial statements, whether due to fraud or error. In making those risk assessments, the auditor considers internal control relevant to the entity's preparation and fair presentation of the financial statements in order to design audit procedures that are appropriate in the circumstances, but not for the purpose of expressing an opinion on the effectiveness of the entity's internal control. Accordingly, we express no such opinion. An audit also includes evaluating the appropriateness of accounting policies used and the reasonableness of significant accounting estimates made by management, as well as evaluating the overall presentation of the financial statements.

Opinions

In our opinion, the financial statements referred to above present fairly, in all material respects, the respective financial position of the governmental activities, each major fund and the aggregate remaining fund information of the Town of Sedgwick, Maine as of June 30, 2019, and the respective changes in financial position for the year then ended in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America.

### ***Required Supplementary Information***

Accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America require that the management's discussion and analysis, budgetary comparison information, schedules of proportionate share of net pension and other post-employment benefit liabilities, and schedules of employer contributions on pages 3 through 6, and 26 through 32, respectively, be presented to supplement the basic financial statements. Such information, although not a part of the basic financial statements, is required by the Governmental Accounting Standards Board, who considers it to be an essential part of financial reporting for placing the basic financial statements in an appropriate operational, economic, or historical context. We have applied certain limited procedures to the required supplementary information in accordance with auditing standards generally accepted in the United States of America, which consisted of inquiries of management about the methods of preparing the information and comparing the information for consistency with management's responses to our inquiries, the basic financial statements, and other knowledge we obtained during our audit of the basic financial statements. We do not express an opinion or provide any assurance on the information because the limited procedures do not provide us with sufficient evidence to express an opinion or provide any assurance.

### ***Supplementary Information***

Our audit was conducted for the purpose of forming opinions on the financial statements that collectively comprise the Town's basic financial statements. The supplementary information is presented for purposes of additional analysis and are not a required part of the basic financial statements. The schedule of expenditures of federal awards is presented for purposes of additional analysis as required by the State of Maine, and is also not a required part of the basic financial statements.

The schedule of expenditures of federal awards and supplementary information are the responsibility of management and were derived from and relate directly to the underlying accounting and other records used to prepare the basic financial statements. Such information has been subjected to the auditing procedures applied in the audit of the basic financial statements and certain additional procedures, including comparing and reconciling such information directly to the underlying accounting and other records used to prepare the basic financial statements or to the basic financial statements themselves, and other additional procedures in accordance with auditing standards generally accepted in the United States of America. In our opinion, the schedule of expenditures of federal awards and supplementary information are fairly stated in all material respects in relation to the basic financial statements as a whole.
