After the 2018 summer we were thrilled with the reception of our display of photos and text relative to the Temperance Society in Sedgwick in the 1850's. So in July of 2019 we assembled another display of photos and memorabilia of the Maine Lake Ice Works which thrived from 1899-1916. This "show" in our library was part of the Touring Through Time week-end, open on both Saturday and Sunday. Over two days we hosted 35 people.
