Important Notice!

TONIGHT (May 15) at 6:00 PM, there will be a special town meeting at the Town Meeting House. On the agenda for the meeting will be the school budget as it was originally proposed in January. This budget represents a significant decrease over last year's budget with much of the reduction coming from the retirement of two teachers, Mrs. Rhodes and Mrs. Werth, who will not be replaced.

If the budget passes at town meeting, there will be a ballot vote the following day. Under the new state law, we are required to have a referendum vote following a positive vote at town meeting. Polls will be open from 1:00-6:00 PM TOMORROW Friday, May 16.

Should the budget pass both steps, it will be enacted by the board.

It is very important for parents and members of community to attend the special town meeting and to vote on Friday. The cuts already made to the budget move us backwards. Next year, we will be combining grades 1 and 2 and grades 3 and 4 so that each is one classroom. This is on top of the very significant cuts in personnel made last year. Any additional cuts will be catastrophic to the school program. Please exercise your right to vote at the Town Meeting House on Thursday, May 15 at 6:00 PM and Friday, May 16 at the balloting between 1:00 and 6:00 PM.

On the Friday balloting, you

vote YES in order to pass the school budget or NO not to pass the school budget. The exact wording of the item is in a notice sent home earlier this week.

Workshop Day Coming May 23
