Volunteerism

MRSA

Methicillin-Resistant Staphylococcus Aureus has received significant attention in the national news lately as a staph infection that is not easily treated and is sometimes fatal. It is important for parents to realize that MRSA, like many infectious diseases, is best avoided by frequent hand washing and cleaning of surfaces. We are reviewing hand washing training and policies and will be working with all kids to make sure they know how important it is to keep their hands clean. As a staff, we will be reviewing procedures for keeping things clean and hygienic. However, it is important for parents to realize that it is predominantly spread by skin to skin contact and not from contact with surfaces.

There have been unconfirmed rumors of a case of MRSA in the area, but there have been other schools reporting them. At this point the best advice we can give to parents is to make sure that cuts or scrapes are covered and treated and to report any cuts or scrapes that fail to heal or look infected to your doctor.
