

## Do You Need a COVID-19 Vaccine?

### WHO is eligible?

- All Maine residents age **16 and older** are now eligible.
- Minors aged **16 and 17** are currently only able to get the Pfizer vaccine and will need parental consent.

### WHERE and HOW are vaccines available?

- **Maine COVID-19 Community Vaccination Help Line: 1-888-445-4111**
  - Monday -Friday, 7 a.m. to 7 p.m., or Saturday-Sunday: 8 a.m.- 2 p.m.
  - For translation services, call the number listed above and state your desired language (for example: "Spanish"). Deaf and hard of hearing individuals may dial 711 and ask to be connected.

  - New appointments added on Mondays and Wednesdays at 2 PM
  - Appointments at the Cross Insurance Center in Bangor are most readily available
  - You will need: insurance information (Medicare card) and contact information for an emergency contact. Many other fields can be filled in with N/A. Social Security Numbers are not required - enter 000-00-0000 if needed.
- **MDI Hospital**

  - Pre-registration available even for those in a phase that is not yet in progress. People are encouraged not to sign up on multiple lists.

  - The Walmart at 17 MYRICK ST in Ellsworth, as well as locations in Bangor/Brewer, are administering vaccine.
  - An online Walmart account is required - sign-up with name and email address.

  - Walgreens at 17 South Street in Blue Hill is administering vaccine.
  - A Walgreens account is required - sign up with name and email address.
- **Hannaford**

  - Scroll down to "State-Specific Information" and click "Maine," then click "Schedule Appointment" to continue to scheduling site.
  - Hannaford at 225 High St Suite 1, Ellsworth, as well as locations in Old Town (04468), Rockland (04841), and Camden (04843), among others, are administering vaccine.
  - Email address is required to register.
  - Scheduler only searches within 50 miles of the zip code entered, so if 04614 doesn't bring up anything, try another zip code if you are willing to travel.

  - Shaws at 175 High Street in Ellsworth, as well as locations in Bangor and Rockland, are administering vaccine.

### WHO can HELP me make an appointment?

- **Healthy Peninsula, Blue Hill**
  - Signing up eligible residents of the Blue Hill peninsula and Deer Isle/Stonington for Northern Light Health sites.
  - Can also help arrange transportation, if necessary.

  - Public computers, wifi, and printers are available for signing up online.

### What if I need a RIDE?

- If you receive MaineCare, you can arrange a ride like you would for a regular doctor’s appointment.
- If you don’t receive MaineCare, you can call **(855) 608-5172**, after you have your appointment and at least 48 hours before your appointment date, to arrange a ride with your local Community Action Agency.
